

The event is proudly supported by the Toowoomba Regional Council and The

From Tuesday to Saturday in the first week of the holidays (2-6 April), Authors Megan Carige, Irena Kobald, and Lee FullARTon will be in the Write Gallery as Authors-in-Residence!

There will be activities set up at stations around the gallery themed around each author and their book and there will be hourly readings by the authors of their very own works!






Twinkles Book Club...

be a reader! need a reader? give a book!

Thanks to the wonderfully generous community answering our call-out for donations via the Facebook group #tlcfortrc, we have been able to press on and bundle up books for another 12 classes at Darling Heights State School. On the 19 March, as well as recording wonderful 'live' reading sessions, we dropped of over 1000 books which will be in homes before the easter bunny saunters along! The awesome coordinator at Darling Heights Community Hub, Ricky Adams is always so open to us disrupting the status quo if it means getting books into the hands of children who need them! (Truly, there was barely a table free in the staff room! Thank you for your patience teachers! And thank you to the DHSS ground staff who found trolleys to get the books from our car boots!)



Thank you again Lee Fullarton for this fabulous image created for International Read to Me Day! We know you are smiling as much as we were looking at this colourful, creative and joyful image which celebrates the magic of reading together! Oh the adventures we have when we read...

Who DID you read to on 19 March?

When the research unequivocally demonstrates that it is important to read to our children every day, then it is easy, we should do it, just like providing clothing, food, and shelter...

And yet, we know the barriers to being so diligent are very real! Parents and carers can be 1. exhausted at the end

of the day; 2. not have books available at home; 3. books they do have are not in language; 4. no-one has ever shown the parent how to read to a child; 5. parents may just not be comfortable reading.

What are our recommended 'work-arounds' then?

- read in the morning. Grabbing an opportunity to read for even just 5 minutes is better than missing out, so encourage your children to keep track of your 'streak'
- 2. pop in and see us (or ask your school to contact us and arrange a book bundle to be dropped off!) and pick up a bundle of books from our One-Way Library. Preloved books are donated in the understanding we are doing all we can to find new homes for them!
- 3. talking and describing the pictures in a book is just the same as actually reading the words, because it is all about extending a child's vocabulary, and the pictures provide the prompts for you!
- 4. check out social media tiktok or instagram - and find television shows like Play School, or teachers who are passionate about reading, and watch how they read to children. The trick is to be upbeat and happy to be reading. It doesn't matter if you stumble over words, that just makes you human!
- find a library, or a playgroup that has volunteers who attend and read. We send out volunteers to

schools and to play groups and offer a 'book club' session for toddlers on Fridays, complimenting the Toowoomba Libraries program.

"Made to Move" is an exciting new idea for Toowoomba region's aspiring young visual artists working with artist and art teacher, Nadine Reynolds.



Workshops start on Wednesday 17 April 3:45-5:15pm and run for 7 weeks until Wednesday 29 May 2024.






Science + Sorcery Club + Access to Mentoring.


