Kat Lynn's EMPOWERING WOMEN will be at The Write Gallery in March. It's not to be missed!





Daring to be different


One of the courageous women of Kat Lynn's exhibition, Chris Morris, has recently written a brave and honest account of her lived experiences.

Write Gallery" The Lighthouse Toowoomba on 20 April between 10am-2pm.


