Animal Rescue - Operation Noah" to an attentive
audience amongst a beautiful setting in the local
Darling Downs area of Ramsay. (How lovely is the

The Great Animal Rescue - Operation Noah is intended for all ages, appealing to young people interested in wildlife, Zimbabweans who recall the iconic story, and anyone curious about the conservation of animals.

The story is about saving wildlife in the Zambezi Valley, Africa when a great concrete dam was built causing extensive flooding. It tells of a team of men, who united over a passion to save animals.

Imagine a herd of elephants finding they can no longer travel their ancient path because a huge body of water has appeared blocking their way? But it is not just elephants, no animal is excluded from the rescue, from the tiny bush baby to the majestic sable, and, rarely seen, aardvark; from Frank's specialty—the snake—to the angry buffalo.

Maverick, and Melanie and Me


Out in The Wild


- 1. What's the best way to get on with people?




Oh the power of possibilities when you call on your community!


If you love reading but haven't yet ventured into the sci-fi genre, this is the perfect opportunity! The best book club reads are the ones that spark conversation, and *Flowers for Algernon* is a thought-provoking classic that does just that.

Originally a short story by Daniel Keyes, *Flowers for Algernon* was later expanded into a novel and published in 1966, winning the **Nebula Award for Best Novel**. The story follows Charlie Gordon, a man with an intellectual disability who undergoes an experimental procedure to enhance his intelligence—an operation first tested on a laboratory mouse named Algernon. Told through Charlie's progress reports, the novel explores themes of intelligence, human dignity, and the ethical dilemmas of scientific advancement.

Despite being a widely studied literary work, Flowers for Algernon has also faced controversy, with attempts to ban it from schools and libraries. Nevertheless, it remains a powerful and moving novel that has been adapted for film, television, and theatre—most notably as the **Academy Award-winning film** *Charly*.

The book is a quick read, so don't let the timeline hold you back. Pick up a copy and join the discussion!


