Made TO Move

Workshop 20th April 10 am - 2pm

"Made to Move" is an exciting new idea for Toowoomba region's aspiring young visual artists working with artist and art teacher, Nadine Reynolds.

Nadine Reynolds is an Art Teacher and

artist. Her current work "Affect/Effect" exhibition is currently at Toowoomba Regional Council's Rosalie Gallery in Goombungee (March 6th – 28th). Her responsive, kinetic work features contemporary stitching embedded in traditional painting and is about the effect we have on each other.

The Workshop will be held At "The Write Gallery" The Lighthouse Toowoomba on 20 April between 10am-2pm.

Cost \$25 (Scholarships available for financial hardship. No questions asked.)

20 Junior artists will have the opportunity to work with Nadine to create work for the "Made to Move "exhibition in the Write gallery at The Lighthouse in November This year.

We are looking for those aged 6 - 16 years for whom Art is their passion.

We are looking for children who have ideas.

We are looking for children who think creatively and can't stop making things.

We are looking for children who have a strong aesthetic sense and would like to improve their skills.

We will be experimenting using a variety of media, working through a guided process to develop ideas in the participants' choices of drawing, painting, printmaking, construction, and

collage. As the workshop follows an artistic process the young artists will have a degree of control over their decision making. They will be free to start with prescribed activities and to branch out to follow their own ideas as real artists do. Nadine will be working to help guide their work and to provide help with solutions to visual problems.

- 1. Using a choice of primaries to develop our own palette.
- 2. Creating a dynamic background.
- 3. Using pen to find our 'line.'
- 4. Creating a crown.



With more than 1400 activities featuring video, music and imagery, LFK is the ideal classroom program that captures interest and supports student learning.



Science + Sorcery Club

Tim Hunter is a qualified editor, has published his first novel AND spent all of last year facilitating the World Building workshops. Now, for 2024 he has devised a really clever version of workshops whereby the Science + Sorcery Club is open to all for only \$120 per term and as the young aspiring writers develop their manuscripts, they can option mentoring sessions for FREE. This is a generous and thoughtful format, and is best

suited to secondary school students.

Students will be guided in creating unique characters and wildly imaginative settings to make story ideas come alive, particularly for those interested in science fiction and fantasy. These genres give us a chance to imagine stories, alternatives, speculate on the impossible, or simply ask: what if? Untangle the ideas to create great backdrops for stories, homes for heroes and villains, or exciting settings for role playing games, like Dungeons & Dragons.

All members of the Sorcery + Science' Writers Club are welcome to access Tim's mentoring sessions FREE. These sessions are held on the same day as Club, 3:30pm to 4:30pm. Students are welcome to use a hot desk to write more after the mentoring session and then attend Club 5:00pm to 6:30pm.

'Science + Sorcery' Writers Club starts on Thursday 1st February, 5:00 to 6:30pm, for 8 weeks (until Thursday 21st March) with mentoring available 3:30pm to 4:30pm on the same day as Club!

The cost is \$120 per person per term and includes access to the FREE mentoring sessions.



Don't be deterred by the start date, nor the term fees! Terese has kept this class open and so will sort fees based on the weeks remaining.

Truly, if you have a little artist in-house, these classes are magical. We overheard one student ask if Terese was available on 'all the others days of the week too please'!



Helping to erase Racism

Inclusivity is at the very hear of what we do at The Lighthouse and we were disheartened to hear that of the increasing reporting of incidents of racism in schools.

In response, the Queensland Human Rights Commission(QHRC) has developed a survey to capture the experiences of racism from school students. They are looking for the views of people between the age of 13 to 20 years old who have experienced racism and/or have witnessed racism during their school years.

This information will assist the development of a resource to assist students to identify, manage and report racism in the school context. QHRC are also developing a resource to support teachers and principals to manage racist behaviours at school.

We encourage our Lighthouse families and supporters to take the time to

complete the <u>survey</u> and also share this survey amongst your networks!

The survey will close on 10 March 2024.
