The impact on the community and businesses wasn't fully realised for another three years, but we are all still reeling from its impacts. The groups focus is positive shout-outs recognising the incredible tenacity of our local businesses, and for community members to source the best for them via word-of-mouth recommendation.

The Charity Expo was such a resounding success that it will become an annual event on the Toowoomba community calendar!

All students and caregivers are welcome to attend.


