If you haven't heard of Nathan Taylor, author, then you certainly will soon! Walking closely in the footsteps of John Marsden, Nathan has written an engaging and inspiring collection of novels for his students, igniting their curiosity and ensuring they fall in love with reading.

The Winterthorn Saga tells the story of Declan Moore, the great-great-grandson of a renowned war hero, who is struggling to come to grips with the fact he possesses no magical ability. In the Dominion of Euryma, witches and wizards are commonplace, but they are also under threat. Someone—or something—is abducting the magical populace, leaving ordinary people like Declan to pick up the pieces.



Wiimali is a Gamilaraay word and meaning 'to light fire' and has been used with permission. This gives you the gentlest of hints as to what this book is about! The book explores the ideas of place, of connection, and finding your voice in just in time to make a difference.

Wiimali lives in Toowoomba, and spends his days roaming the country with his friends. When they discover a grass fire started by a bolt of lightning, their perfect day quickly changes.

This remarkable book has been created by children from Harlaxton State School with support and guidance of The Child Writes Fund and the generous financial support of the FKG Group printing 1000 copies to be distributed for FREE to the children in the community.

The books illustrations were supported by Emma Mactaggart, Dr Tarn McLean, Brittany Moore, and Marisa Ballinger (see below L to R)






#### ... is not a barrier! Read to Lead

You can't see Paddy and Joshua in the shot as they are tucked in behind the camera and beside the bookcase, but you can see Leigh Lucht! Leigh was thrown in the proverbial deep end, and graciously talked to camera and read, as we were testing 'proof of concept' for a campaign showing new parents how to read to their children. Parents truly do know how important it is to read to their children regularly, but barriers preventing parents from reading regularly include (1) not having books, (2) not knowing how to read, (3) not knowing what to read, (4) not having any experience of being read to themselves, (5) being too tired, and (6) not having enough time, are all things we want to show can be overcome. Our thinking is to create a suite of videos for tik tok

showing parents how to overcome these barriers - so they can 'Read to Lead'!

Thank you QCF for the funding to create some samples for us to attach to future grant applications.

# Write Your Story, Own Your Strength

Children's Writing for Expression Workshops: Explore Narrative Therapy Techniques with Tanya Vessey.

Write Your Story is a series of workshops offered after school, Monday's 3:30pm to 5:00pm for FOUR WEEKS starting Monday 9th October. It is

for children from upper primary/early high school. Participants will learn techniques to navigate change and tap into creativity with story-telling activities across four workshops. Creativity and change happen consciously or unconsciously. Our response to creativity or change is the result of personal beliefs; this means that our beliefs create our response to change. The ability to adapt to change requires self-awareness and techniques to navigate what is beyond our control. By using the structure of story to tap into creativity, these workshops address creating change to navigate challenges with a positive mindset and self-knowledge.

These workshops have been made entirely possible to offer free to participants because of a generous grant from VARIETY QLD.




