

Welcome to Week 1 for 2024 at The Lighthouse Toowoomba

And now it begins...

The Lighthouse Toowoomba is merely weeks away from its 2nd birthday. Having opened with a whisper of an idea on the 22nd of February 2022 to hurtle frantically towards our first birthday in 2023, it is fascinating to measure our maturity by the volume of free workshops we can continue to

deliver, as well as events and opportunities for the whole community.

These newsletters are also a reminder to ourselves where we have been and the direction we are heading, as much as they are designed to inform you about all that this creative hub is capable of offering (and receiving) from our wonderful community.

We start 2024 with workshops for all ages for Term 1 and our very first event is a *world premiere* of a multi-modal exhibition by artist, author and composter Matt Ottley. The opening night includes an opportunity to see a film, be involved with a Q+A and book signing with Mat AND the official opening of the exhibition! We really are beginning the year as we mean to finish the year - with wonder!

The Write Gallery is actually fully booked for the year, with exhibitions focused on literacy, creativity, and wellbeing. Again we will be celebrating the writers and illustrators and creators amongst us.



MATT OTTLEY has just won the World Fantasy Book Award, is Australia's illustrator nominee for the 2024 * Hans Christian Anderson Awards, and is bringing his remarkable work to Toowoomba for what will be the *world premiere* of his exhibition 'The Tree of Ecstasy and Unbearable Sadness'. It is a multimodal exhibition conceived to show each of us what mental illness feels like using music, art, and film, and you are invited.

As well as the exhibition being open to the public **1-29 February**, it is also awesome to share that we have already made contact with every single secondary school in the region offering dedicated opening times for students 15+ to visit so they can immerse themselves in the work. Given the sensitive nature of the exhibition, we suggest it will be an opportunity for quiet introspective viewing, allowing time for the students to write their personal response to the topic.

With the generous support of the Toowoomba Regional Council, we also have three additional sessions available with Tanya Vessey (utilising narrative therapy techniques) to lead workshops for student groups who wish to be more actively engaged. It is exciting to be starting the year as we intend to finish the year – using the platforms of art, literacy, and creativity to promote the wellbeing of all children in our region – is incredible for us. Given we can also promote the normalisation of conversations about mental health, well, hopefully you will appreciate how important this event is and we are grateful for your support.

Matt and Tina's drive is to destigmatise mental illness, to increase empathy and compassion for anyone in a dark place, and to open our hearts to

goodwill of others. With free teacher resources available, a stunningly beautiful homage to benefactors with the Silipo Variations, and intentional multi-modal work, this is not to be missed.

 contribution to children's literature.








Did you know...



Free access to LITERACY FOR KIDS here at The Lighthouse.


Attendees will be able to work through the program from Levels 3 to 15 at their own pace, with the guidance and support from our fabulous volunteers.




