
Emily thanks Variety Qld

Explore Narrative Therapy Techniques with Tanya Vessey


We have rescheduled these special writing workshops to Term 4, to allow enough time for the word to get around. This 4 workshop series is open to ALL children in the upper primary/ early secondary years. This is a pilot program made possible by Variety Qld, for which we are incredibly grateful

 Participants will learn techniques to navigate change and tap into creativity with story-telling activities across four workshops.

- Creativity and change happen consciously or unconsciously. Our response to creativity or change is the result of personal beliefs; this means that our beliefs create our response to change.
- The ability to adapt to change requires selfawareness and techniques to navigate what is beyond our control.
- By using the structure of story to tap into creativity, these workshops address creating change to navigate challenges with a positive mindset and self-knowledge.

The program is run over 4 weeks, and participants attend all four sessions. Stating Monday 9th October and runs after school from 3:30pm-5:30pm


