


The Journey of an Art Therapist

The Write Gallery is glad to host Sarah Hazelhurst, an art therapist. Vivid, bright, and beautiful colours are used in almost colours. When there is a monochrome theme in these beautiful displays of emotions, it uses the talent of detail and heavy sketching to show how the artist is feeling. Sarah has been studying art therapy since 2006, 'It's been a long journey.' But she has finally made it and is now an art therapist producing beautiful work. The artworks present a range of emotions, feelings, and situations, ranging from beautiful colourful women to a lonely figure buried by darkness. Art therapy can be a way for people reaching out for help who can't put how they feel into words. 'When it's on paper you can't lie. It's you,' Sarah said about how you can lie with your words but when your emotions are on a piece of

paper it's impossible to fake what you're feeling inside.




Twinkles Book Club... Volunteers WANTED

The Twinkles Book Club is a program run by The Lighthouse Toowoomba is based around reading books to toddlers and their caretakers. It provides somewhere safe and peaceful for toddlers to use to learn, explore and allow their curiosity to take flight. Reading to toddlers can be an integral factor in the children's development. Storytelling can help toddlers learn about and identify sounds, words, and language. Additionally, it can also help to stimulate their imaginations, expand their social skills and vocabulary, and allow them to learn more about the world which they live in. This allows parents and their children to strengthen their bonds. The club also permits the young children to meet other people and more children that are their age, further broadening their social skills and helping to coax them into coming out of their shells.

We run two sessions here at The Lighthouse on Wednesday and Friday 9:30am to 10:30am;

Harlaxton State School Thursday 10:45am to 11:15am; Newtown State School Tuesday 9:30am to 10:15am. It would be incredible if we could offer it at more schools as an outreach program. INTERESTED? Email emma@thelighthousetoowoomba.org for more information.



Brookie represented her fabulous school when attending Flip Flop this week when she added Greenmount State School to our 'key to literacy, the key to the Lighthouse' board of fame!






